



CME'26 – Contemporary Mathematics Education Conference

This is the Announcement of the Contemporary Mathematics Education Conference CME'26, which will take place in Łódź, Poland on **6-9 July 2026**. All researchers in mathematics education, teacher trainers and teachers are invited to attend and contribute.

1. Aim and focus

The conference is intended as a working meeting for those who are interested in teaching mathematics at all educational levels. This means that the conference is addressed to:

- teacher trainers involved in:
 - pre-service teacher training
 - in-service teacher training
- researchers interested in all aspects of teaching and learning mathematics (establishment of mathematical concepts and procedures, development of mathematical thinking, teacher-student interactions, teaching processes, textbook analysis, etc.)
- mathematicians, who want to enhance their teaching at school
- reflective practitioners (teachers).

2. Conference theme: *Mathematics education in a changing world – Looking back and looking forward.*

The tenth CME conference (first held in 2008) invites contributions that examine curricular developments in areas such as artificial intelligence, mathematical modeling, and inclusivity, eventually situated within historical perspectives on European and international mathematics education. Submissions are expected to extend this established continuum by addressing contemporary challenges and advancing innovative approaches to teaching and learning.

3. Activities during the conference

- Plenary lectures: One-hour long lectures. The program includes plenary sessions during which invited speakers will focus on aspects of the conference theme. The plenaries provide a shared input to the conference and form a basis for discussions during the working seminars.
- Working seminars: The most important part of the conference. We plan to organize the work focused on three educational levels: kindergarten and primary school (3–9-year-olds), primary school (10–13-year-olds), secondary school and upper-secondary school (14–18-year-olds). Each participant is invited to be a member of one of the working seminars. Each group will be coordinated by a leader.

- Research Reports: Parallel sessions of 20 minutes of oral presentations, followed by a 10-minute discussion. Presentations are related to the theme of the conference.
- Workshops: They contain a more extended type of contribution which should focus on concrete activities and encourage an active participation through working on materials, problems, or questions. The workshops can last for about 1.5 hours.
- Poster exhibition: They refer to small-scale studies or studies which are incomplete.

4. Deadlines

5. Time and place

The conference will be hosted by the Lodz University of Technology in Łódź, Poland, and will take place on July 6-9, 2026. Further details on the participation, travel and accommodation will be provided to CME'26 registered participants at a later stage.

6. Language

The official conference language is English.

7. Conference fee

The conference fee is 360 Euros (reduced fee for students and PhD students: 240 Euros), which includes the conference proceedings and other materials, four lunches, coffee breaks and social activities for participants, such as an excursion and the conference dinner. The payment of the registration fee is a necessary condition for the evaluation of submitted papers. A limited amount of funding is available to participants who experience financial difficulties to attend the CME'26 conference.
